Invacuations and Evacuations:

It is Department for Education Policy that we practise and familiarise our students and teachers about what to do in an emergency.

We have the following drills that we will be practising over the up-and-coming weeks:

1. Invacuation (soft lockdown) where children remain working in their classroom, but all buildings are locked
2. Invacuation (hard lockdown) where all children will shelter out of sight, and all buildings are locked
3. Evacuation where we have to take children from buildings to a safe outside location

Each of these drills has a specific bell. It is important that all children recognise them and what they mean. For this term, all children will be advised when these practise drills are happening as we step them through the process. We will advise you through text message when they occur so that you can talk to your child about them. Thank you for your support.

What does this mean for your child?

- **Wellbeing:**

We focus on helping students feel safe, supported, and ready to learn. This includes teaching positive behaviour, developing supportive school language, and ensuring every child has what they need to thrive both emotionally and academically.

- **Effective Questioning:**

We explicitly teach students how to ask strong, thoughtful questions—helping them think deeply and make meaningful links in their learning. Our teachers choose activities and assessment tasks that really show what students are learning and understanding.

- **Literacy and Numeracy:**

We use evidence-based approaches in reading, spelling, writing, and mathematics. This means consistent routines and teaching methods throughout the school, so students feel confident as they grow and transition between classes and year levels.

Our values—Respect, Responsibility, and Safety—underpin everything we do. We value open communication, celebrate differences, and believe every child should feel safe and respected.

Effective Questioning

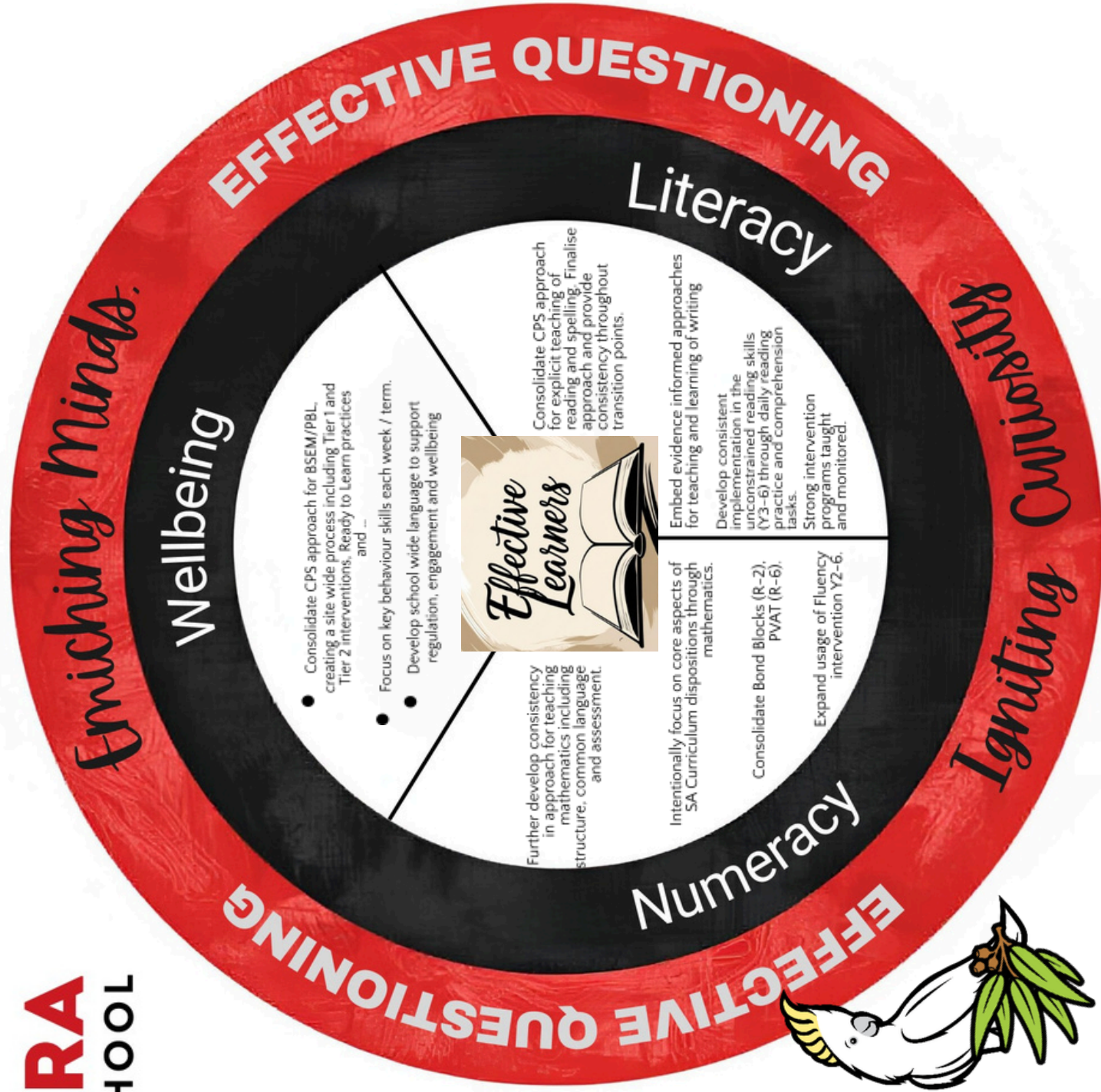
Consolidate CPS approach for incursions and excursions, linking experience to deeper thinking
