Message from the Principal - Steph Tulloch

Welcome to Term Two!

I hope you all had a safe and restful break. The incursion yesterday was very interesting for our students. The focus was on Aboriginal survival and technology. Your children were very engaged.

I'd like to outline some important information to support a successful and positive return to school.

Morning routines

- School gates open at 8:30 am daily. This is when breakfast club is accessible for all students. It is a lovely time for children to connect with their friends and staff on duty.
- 8:40 am is when classrooms doors open and children are welcomed in to organise themselves for the day. They get to chat to their teacher, see what the day looks like and to organise their books and equipment.
- 8:50 am is the start of their educational learning. It sets them up for success, feeding straight into literacy learning in most classes. It is important that your children are at school and ready to learn by 8:50am.
- We understand that saying goodbye in the morning can sometimes be difficult, especially at the start of the school year. However, we kindly ask parents and carers to make farewells as calm and brief as possible. Prolonged goodbyes can make it harder for children to settle into class and may contribute to feelings of anxiety or reluctance about coming to school.
- A smooth and confident farewell helps children feel safe and supported as they begin their day. If you would like any advice or support with morning routines or transitions, please reach out to your child's teacher or the leadership team—we're here to help.

Uniform Requirements

It is our expectation that all students wear the correct school uniform each day. Wearing the correct uniform helps all children feel a sense of belonging to our school community. Pants and skirts must be black and mid-thigh or longer in length. Children should wear sneakers/closed toe shoes to school. Boots with heels are not a safe option and are not appropriate for sports lessons and play.

A reminder that hats are not mandatory items in Term Two, however we still have some warm sunny days ahead. Keep the in bags for these occasions before packing them away in a safe place at home ready for Term Four.

Senior jumpers will be distributed to our Year 6 students early this term.

Please note that makeup is not permitted at school, and jewellery should be kept to a minimum for both safety and equity.

Toys should not be coming to school.

Uniform Shop and Finance Window: this will be open every morning to assist in the purchasing of the correct uniform or paying for excursions etc. It will also be open on Wednesday afternoons. If you need to pay money outside of these hours, please fill in your information on the envelope available in the front office.

Excursions—Space Inquiry

We are very excited about our whole-school focus on Space this term. As part of our study:

- Year 3–6 students will visit the Planetarium on either 18 or 20 May.
- Reception–Year 2 students will have an engaging, space-themed incursion at school.

Year 6 to High School Transition

Families of Year 6 students will soon receive high school transition information. Please ensure that your contact details are up to date by the end of Week 1 so you don't miss this important communication, which will be distributed in Week 2.

Phones and devices: in line with department policy, mobile phones are not permitted to be used by students once on school grounds. Students are required to hand phones to their teacher for safe keeping once they arrive.

Student Reports

Student reports will be issued at the end of the term. Please be advised that these will be sent to you via an online portal. They will not be printed this year. It is essential that we have your correct and current email address on file. If you need to update your details, please contact the front office as soon as possible.

School Values and Behaviour

As always, we expect our students to demonstrate our school values of Responsibility, Respect, and Safety at all times. We have also had a focus on being kind. When you notice your child following these values at home, in public, at school etc. ensure you let them know. Thank you for your continued support in reinforcing these values at home.

There will be a **Pupil Free Day on Tuesday 9 June** (Week 7), following the King's Birthday public holiday. This will create a long weekend break for families. OSHC services will be available on the day for those who require care—please book early to secure your place.

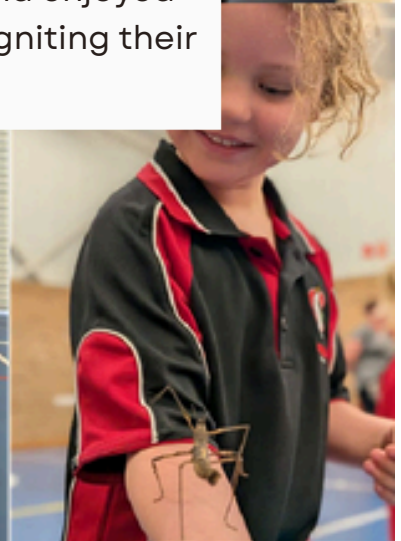

Room 5 and 6 have been crawling with curiosity—our budding entomologists—have been learning about insects and have truly 'ant-icipated' every activity. We used our curiosity to wonder what insect could have made the fantastic structures that were appearing outside our classroom. Look at all the questions and predictions the Early Years students came up with to our, I wonder. Students then drew pictures of what they predicted might live here.
