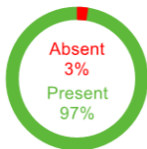

Celebrating NAIDOC Week

'Niina Marni' is the Kurna word for 'hello', it means are you well. 'Marni'ai' means 'I am well'. Coorara is on Kurna land and we pay our respects to the Kurna people and to the Elders both past and present.

NAIDOC week is about celebrating 65 000 years of history, culture and achievements. This years theme 'Heal Country' recognises that Country and our cultural heritage are the essence of who we are. NAIDOC week is also a time to think about our future and this starts with educating our next generation of leaders. This week teachers have used the theme of NAIDOC week to grow children's understanding of our history, the culture and achievements of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people.

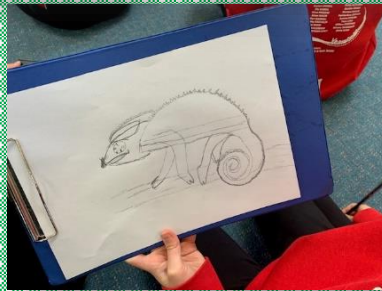
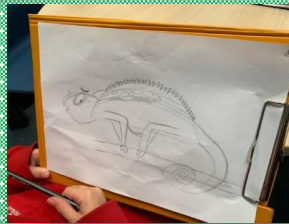

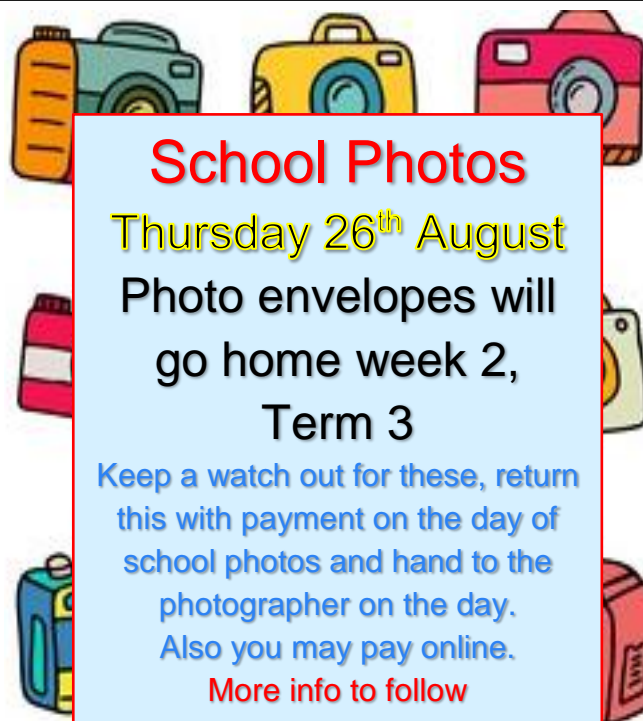
