Swings: We have had four swings installed close to the senior playground. They are getting a lot of use, and the kids are enjoying them immensely. I am looking forward to seeing some more swings come into the junior playground space in 2026.

Enrolments: Coorara Primary is open for enrolments for the 2026 and 2027 school year. If you do not have your enrolments forms in, or you know of families that want to come to Coorara and have not yet enrolled, please collect an enrolment pack from the front office. Our numbers are becoming quite tight in some year levels, so advanced notice is much appreciated.

Class placement: It is the time of the year that we look at class placement for the 2026 school year. If there are any requests you would like us to consider, please can you put this is writing via email and send it to the office by Friday the 24 October. Please be aware, we may not be able to accommodate all requests.

Ready for Reception: Our reception transition program will commence this coming term in weeks 5, 6 and 7. It will be held in the Green Unit on the Wednesday. This is for all children enrolled to start Reception in Term 1, 2026. Please be aware we are not zoned to a kindergarten or suburb and can accept most enrolments.

Transition Day: The Transition Day for children starting at Coorara in other year levels in 2026 will be held in week 9, on Tuesday 9 December from 10:30 – 11:30. This is the same day all current students find out their 2026 class placement.

Uniforms: As we head into Term 4, can you please ensure your child has the correct school uniform. The jumpers/windcheaters must have the Coorara Logo on them. Polo shirts are available from the finance window if your child needs a replacement.

Hats become a compulsory part of the school uniform. Please check your child has a hat for the first day of term. If not, please purchase one from the school, and make sure it is clearly named. Please make sure all items are named. I am sorting through many lost property items each week and as they are not named, they stay on the lost property rack and available to others.

World Teachers Day is on Friday 25 October. This is a chance to celebrate your child's teacher, including specialist teacher, for the amazing job they do. The staff at Coorara are some of the most professional, supportive, caring and dedicated individuals I have had the opportunity to work alongside. This is an International Celebratory day to say, 'Thank you'.

Messages from Students: Parents please be aware if your child is leaving early or will be absent, these messages need to come from the students parent/caregiver - NOT from the student. Please write the teacher a note, pass the message on verbally from yourself, or ring the office to pass on the message.

Student Sign IN Kiosk: When students are signing in for Late Arrival, if they are not signed in by a parent this will be entered as 'U' – unexplained. Therefore, a text message will be sent out to the parent for the 'U'. This is why many parents are receiving a text message for an explanation. Please sign your child in, or phone the school.

Yr 6 School Camp 2026: Year 6 children will be attending Glenhaven Camp.

The cost for the 3 days at Glenhaven is approx \$350:00. To assist parents of children attending this camp, we are holding a Bunnings BBQ fundraiser. This is to directly help families of students attending the Year 6 camp.

It will be held on **1 November from 8am-4pm**. The money raised will be portioned out to directly to these students whose parents assist on the day. We hope to have another date available to assist later on.

Please make sure you return your BBQ form to the school office asap, indicating what shift you can do, and how many shifts you would like to stay for. We are requiring 4 people per shift, the more shifts you do, the more money goes towards your child's camp.
