

#### **Spotlight on Phonics**

Learning to read is one of the most complex things we do.... Our brain is not wired to learn to read therefore children need to be explicitly taught how to read. Learning to read requires two abilities: the ability to correctly recognise words and the ability to understand language (words and their meanings).

What is Phonics? Phonics is the ability to decode words using letter- sound relationships. Children need to learn that there is a relationship between individual sounds (phonemes) of spoken language and the letters (graphemes) that that represent those sounds in written language. The burger below illustrates this relationship between the phonemes and graphemes.



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When do we start teaching phonics? Phonics teaching starts in the first few weeks of Reception. In these first few weeks children learn the phonemes of six letters: s a t p i n and by learning these 6 sounds children can blend to read about 39 words. At Coorara we follow a teaching scope and sequence and by the end of year 1 children have learnt all single letter—sounds and common combinations. This means students have enough letter-sound knowledge to be able to read a wide range of texts.

Do young learners only learn phonics? No. Phonics Teaching is very important but it is not the only skills beginning readers need to learn. Along with phonics, children need to be taught the other skills of reading, these are known as the Big 6 of Reading- vocabulary, comprehension, fluency, oral language, phonics and phonological awareness.
