Understanding the Whole Story: Working Together for Our Children

At Coorara Primary School, we value the strong partnership between families and our school community. We understand that, at times, children may come home with stories about their school day that can cause concern or prompt questions. As parents and educators, it is natural to want to advocate for our children and support their wellbeing.

However, it's important to remember that children's perspectives are shaped by their experiences and emotions, and may not always reflect the full context of a situation. We encourage families to take a moment to talk things through calmly with their children and help them think about events from different viewpoints. This process not only supports your child's emotional growth but can also provide a fuller, clearer understanding of what occurred.

If you are ever unsure or concerned about something your child has shared, please reach out to us. We are here to listen, answer questions, and work together to resolve any issues. Approaching these conversations with openness and collaboration allows us to find solutions and strengthen trust between home and school.

Together, we can help our children develop important skills in communication, empathy, and resilience.

Emergency Drills

At Coorara Primary School, the safety and wellbeing of our students and staff is our highest priority. As part of our ongoing commitment to ensuring a safe environment, we regularly schedule invacuation and evacuation drills. These drills help everyone understand what to do in the event of an emergency, such as a fire or an external threat. At times, we may notify students and staff in advance to help familiarise them with the procedures, while on other occasions we may conduct unannounced drills to ensure everyone is prepared to respond calmly and effectively in a real-life situation. Practising these routines builds confidence and ensures that, in the unlikely event of an emergency, we can act quickly and safely together.


